ACADEMICUS: Rewiring the Brain? The Psychology of Technology

Rapid developments in technology are introducing unanticipated dangers along with new opportunities for humanity. To understand and enhance the human-technology relationship, this program will explore the factors that shape people's attitudes about new technologies (e.g., social media, smartphones, robots, self-driving cars, artificial intelligence), and how the use of these technologies transform how people live, work, play, and interact, and the impact on their psychological well-being.

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ACADEMICUS: What Makes Us Human? Capturing the Essence of Humanity in Science Fiction

This workshop is an introduction to the topic. An in-depth exploration is possible via e-Learning.

From Frankenstein to Bladerunner, science fiction has long been used to explore alternative possibilities and futures for ourselves, our societies and our planet. This program is an exploration of various key philosophical issues through various works of science fiction. Using thought experiments, imaginings and models in philosophy and other disciplines such as biology, economics and physics, this program aims to reveal what can thinking about alternative possibilities tell us about our world, and why.

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
